

Highlights of Iran and Armenia - 15 days

This two week tour marries exotic Iran with the world's oldest Christian nation, Armenia. A packed programme celebrates the rich cultural heritage of the two neighbours, featuring ancient mosques and palaces as well as monasteries precariously perched alongside river gorges and on hill tops. The tour will delight history fans and architecture buffs, interesting anyone with a desire to travel a little off the beaten track and reap the rewards of a warm welcome.

ITINERARY

Day 1 - Shiraz

Our driver will be waiting at the airport for your arrival. You'll transfer to your hotel and there'll be time for you to rest and settle in before our tour programme begins tomorrow. Overnight in Shiraz. (D)

Day 2 - Shiraz

The name of Shiraz will be a familiar one to wine lovers; the grape originated here though these days, Shiraz wine comes mainly from France and Australia rather than Iran. The vineyards may be no more, but there are plenty of sights to explore. Your included city tour today takes you first to Nasir Al Mulk mosque; known as the Pink Mosque, it was completed in 1888. From there, you'll visit Vakil Complex, comprising a mosque, traditional baths and a thriving bazaar. You'll round off the day's sightseeing with the imposing Karimkhan Citadel, the beautiful Eram Garden and Hafez Tomb. Overnight in Shiraz. (B,D)

Day 3 - Shiraz - Persepolis - Naghsh-e Rostam - Pasargadae - Isfahan

This morning you'll set off for the fabled city of Isfahan. We'll break our journey at Persepolis. This UNESCO World Heritage Site was founded in 518BC as the capital of the Achaemenid Empire. Constructed on an immense terrace, the breathtaking palace complex was one of the most impressive sights in Persia, and now even in its ruined state it is a wonderful place. From Persepolis, you'll move on to Naghsh-e Rostam, an ancient necropolis famous for its reliefs cut into the rock. Our final stop will be at Pasargadae, another UNSECO World Heritage Site. Cyrus the Great built it as the capital of the Achaemenid Empire and it's also where you'll encounter his tomb. Overnight in Isfahan. (B,D)

Day 4 - Isfahan

Isfahan was abandoned as a capital in the 18th century when the seat of government shifted to Tehran. This meant that much of the historic buildings were left intact and today, the city is a delight for its Persian architecture. Your included sightseeing tour takes you to the Naghshe Jahan Square Complex, where you'll find the Imam Mosque, Ali Qapu and Sheikh Lotfollah Mosque. There'll be time to rummage in the Qeysarieh Bazaar, renowned for carpets and kilims. Round off the day with visits to Chehel Sotun Palace and the Si-o Se pol and Khajou bridges before returning to the hotel to relax. Overnight in Isfahan. (B,D)

Day 5 - Isfahan - Abyaneh - Kashan

Today we set off for Kashan, stopping off en route at Abyaneh. This place is nicknamed the "red village" on account of its rich red soil and homes of a similar colour. Its narrow alleyways straggle up the lower flanks of Karkas Mountain. From a distance, it's a pictureseque sight and close up you'll enjoy learning about its clay architecture and living traditions. In Kashan, you'll pay a visit to the 19th century Boroujerdi House. It was built by an architect for his bride, the daughter of a wealthy merchant, and is now a museum. Finally, you'll stop at the 16th century Fin Garden, the oldest surviving garden in Iran. It's notorious as the site of the murder of Amir Kabir, the Qajarid chancellor, taken out by an assassin sent by King Nasereddin Shah in 1852. Overnight in Kashan. (B,D)

Day 6 - Kashan - Tehran

Our tour continues today to the Iranian capital Tehran. Occupying a spectacular location on the lower slopes of

the Alborz Mountains, this backdrop of snow-capped peaks frames many a panoramic view in the city. You'll enjoy a visit to Niaravan Palace, a historical complex which is also home to the Sahebqranियeh Palace, and the Tajrish Bazaar and Square, in this, Iran's most liberal and secular city. Overnight in Tehran. (B,D).

Day 7 - Tehran - Tabriz

You'll tackle more of Tehran's major sights today, beginning with Golestan Palace. This walled palace complex dates from the Qajar period and forms one of the oldest groups of buildings in the country. It was once, in the 18th century, the seat of government, but now it's more famous as the source of inspiration for countless Iranian artists and architects who come to marvel at its lavish interiors and stylish exteriors. Also on the itinerary today is the archaeological section of the National Museum and also a visit to the Crown Jewels Museum. You'll round off the day with a flight to Tabriz, in the north west of the country. Overnight in Tabriz. (B,D)

Day 8 - Tabriz - Jolfa

This morning your sightseeing programme includes some of the highlights of Tabriz, located on the ancient Silk Road. You'll pay a visit to the Azerbaijan Museum to learn a little of the city's archaeology and history before making your way to the Blue Mosque. Dating from the 15th century but largely rebuilt, the turquoise mosaics on its entrance archway are original. El-Goli Park completes the itinerary in Tabriz, and then we transfer to Jolfa. We'll squeeze in a trip to the Armenian St Stephen's monastery, dramatically sited in a deep canyon, before checking into our hotel. Overnight in Jolfa. (B,D)

Day 9 - Jolfa - Armenia border - Goris

This morning we set off by car for the Armenian border, crossing at Nordooz. Your driver will assist with any customs and immigration formalities and you'll cross over to Meghry on the Armenian side of the border to meet your new guide. Setting out for Goris, you'll make your way along a beautiful valley alongside a stream to the cave village of Khndzoresk. Explore the caves and rock formations before continuing on to Goris where you'll spend the night. (B,D)

Day 10 - Goris - Tatev - Noravank - Khor Virap - Yerevan

Armenia is the world's oldest Christian nation, and today you'll visit some of its most remarkable monasteries and ancient sites. Begin with Tatev Monastery, accessed via the Wings of Tatev, one of the world's longest cable cars. This scenic journey offers breathtaking views across the valley, making the approach to Tatev truly unforgettable. Next, we'll visit the 12th-century Noravank Monastery, beautifully nestled within a steep-sided canyon. Climb the chapel's dramatic front steps for panoramic views back along the valley from the upper level. After Noravank, we'll stop at Areni, where you'll explore Bird's Cave, a fascinating archaeological site revealing insights into Armenia's prehistoric past through ancient artifacts. We'll then visit the acclaimed Areni Winery, where you can sample local wines and fruit-infused spirits - ideal for souvenirs. Our final stop is the historic Khor Virap Monastery, which offers iconic views of Mount Ararat across the border in Turkey, a deeply meaningful sight for Armenians. You'll return to Yerevan for the night. (B,D)

Day 11 - Yerevan - Echmiadzin - Zvartnots - Yerevan

Today's included sightseeing comprises a city tour of the Armenian capital. Imposing Republic Square is one of the city's most distinctive landmarks. You'll also pay a visit to the manuscript museum known as the Matenadaran. Just outside the city centre you'll find the poignant and moving Genocide Museum, which graphically explains the events of more than a century ago. Another key part of the Tsitsernakaberd memorial complex is the obelisk and eternal flame, its simplicity creating a serene environment for contemplation. Later, you'll visit the Mother See of Holy Echmiadzin, the spiritual and administrative heart of the Armenian Church. The tour will continue to the ruins of the glorious 7th century Zvartnots Cathedral before returning to the city for another overnight stay. (B,D)

Day 12 - Yerevan - Garni - Geghard - Yerevan

You'll make your way out of town to the Pagan Temple of Garni. Dating from the 1st century, it stands in stark contrast to the many Christian monasteries scattered across the countryside. Next, we'll head to the stunning Garni Gorge, known for its unique geological formations, often referred to as the "Symphony of Stones." Here, you can admire the breathtaking landscape formed by towering basalt columns. Nearby, you'll visit the UNESCO-listed Geghard Monastery, which is intricately carved into the cliffs of the Azat River gorge. On your way back to Yerevan, we'll stop at a local house where you'll have the opportunity to learn how to make traditional Armenian lavash, with hands-on participation encouraged! You'll return to Yerevan for the night. (B,D)

Day 13 - Yerevan - Sevan - Dilijan - Haghpat

Today we'll leave Yerevan bound for Lake Sevan, the pearl of Armenia. On a hilltop overlooking the lake you'll encounter the delightful Sevanavank Monastery, occupying one of the most captivating locations of all Armenia's monasteries. The church is impressive, its graveyard littered with engraved standing stones known as khachkars.

Moving on, you'll travel to Dilijan, a resort and spa town. Last of all, you'll visit Haghpat Monastery, one of the largest religious and cultural centres of mediaeval Armenia. The holes you'll see in its floors were used to store wine. Tonight your accommodation is in Haghpat. (B,D)

Day 14 - Haghpat - Sanahin - Goshavank - Yerevan

Your itinerary makes a loop back towards Yerevan today. From Haghpat, you'll head to Sanahin Monastery. Twinned with Haghpat, Sanahin's name translates as "older than that one". The cavernous interior features plenty of tombstones on the floor. Step on them: it's commonly held that if you do, you're freeing the dead of their sins. Look to see the curtain across the main body of the church, which marks that it still functions as a place of worship. Your tour will conclude with a visit to Goshavank monastery before returning to spend the final night in Yerevan. (B,D)

Day 15 - Yerevan

Today marks the end of your tour. We trust that Iran and Armenia's rich cultural heritage and long history have made for an interesting and memorable visit. (B)

Step 3 - Confirmation of your booking

Step 4 - Payment

Please note, if your departure date is more than 56 days you will need to pay the deposit, which should cover the full cost of the flight (if applicable), plus 10% of the land-only arrangements (minimum BJ100) per person towards your tour.

The outstanding payment must be made 56 days prior to departure. If you book less than 56 days before departure, full payment must be made at the time of your booking. You can make your payment by bank transfer, debit or credit card, cheque, bankers draft or postal order. You will find all relevant payment details in your invoice.
